## Sewing and Service

This Monday, February 7th, the women's sewing class will begin again! More than a dozen women began sewing in September of 2009 and progressed quickly in the new skill, while also enjoying the time of fellowship and sense of community. Throughout the course of a year, the ladies made dresses, quilted squares, costumes for a children's choir, handbags, and aprons, among other useful items. After taking some time off, the classes will begin again on the first Monday of each month. This first Monday in February, women will focus on a project that gives back. A local sewing shop, Quilt 'n' Sew has joined American Patchwork Quilting (APQ, a national organization) in the *1 Million Pillowcase Challenge*. APQ suggests that local organizations designate 1 or 2 local charities to be the recipients of the pillowcases. In Fredericksburg, pillowcases have been going to Hope House and the Micah Cold Weather Shelter. FBC has the opportunity to volunteer at the Cold Weather Shelter each Friday night. On several occasions, guests have requested these colorful and bright, homemade pillowcases over the typical white they receive. We may never know how a fun fabric and colorful place to rest your head may comfort those in need. Whether you sew, are interested in this project, or just love fellowship, join the sewing group anytime this Monday between 9:30am and 1pm in **Room A100**.

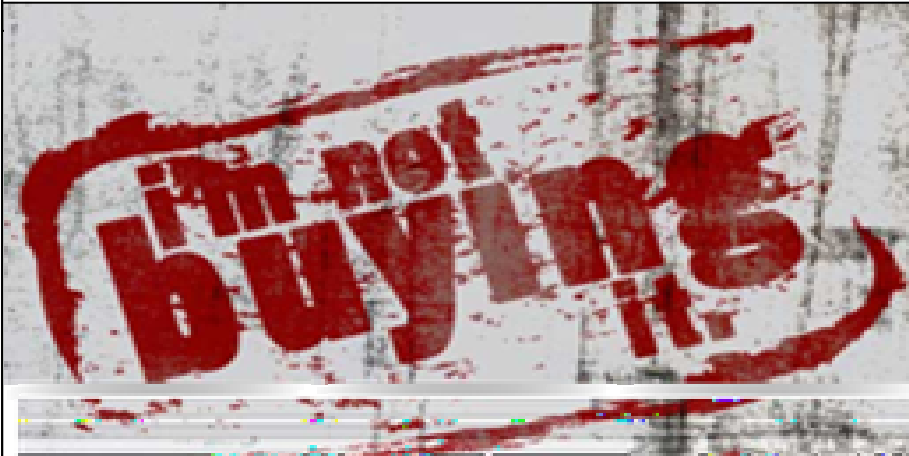
## Honoring with Flowers
