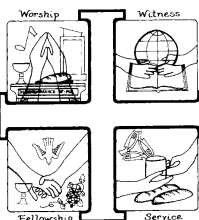

## **Lent 2010 – Walk To Jerusalem**

**In the Third Week of Lent, we walked 1411.2 miles!**

**Combined with the first two weeks, we have a total of 3988 Miles!**

Whew! We are finally reaching the other side of the Atlantic Ocean and we have enough miles to be on the West Coast of the Continent of Africa. Our nearest Cooperative Baptist Fellowship Field Personnel serve in Liberia.

In rural Liberia, Jessy (and wife Calandra) Togba-Doya are empowering a community and being the presence of Christ through education and economic development ministries.

In 2006, Jessy helped open an elementary school as one of their first ministry projects in Liberia. They've also started a micro-loan project to help break the cycle of poverty.

With all the development work they do, the Togba-Doyas haven't lost sight of the reason they came to Liberia – to share Christ. Nearly 20 villagers – including Jessy's mother – have accepted Christ through watching the Jesus Film. Beyond that, there is need for spiritual and emotional healing after more than 14 years of civil war, where many children were soldiers and many civilians were scarred.

"It is just not enough to preach 'Jesus saves' throughout the villages we serve," Jessy Togba-Doya said. "People need to meet the gospel being lived out in our lives. We seek to be the presence of Christ through our work by leading lives that point to Christ, being his hands and feet in hopeless situations."

So how about us? As we walk toward Jerusalem, are we living out the gospel? Are we serving as the presence of Christ as we work, go to school, play sports, engage in community activities and ministries? We have experienced the blessing of receiving new church family members who have come to us from various parts of Africa! What beautiful people and how strong their faith has been as they have experienced very difficult circumstances, losses, and changes. As we interact with these new members of our church family, I have seen the face of Christ in these new friends! They tell stories of courage and faith in Christ in the midst of devastating loss and they demonstrate love for one another and for me.

This week, as we pray for the ministries of Jessy and Calandra Togba-Doya, let us also pray that we may seek the face of Christ in each and every one of our neighbors and that we may seek to be the face of Christ in the world around us!
