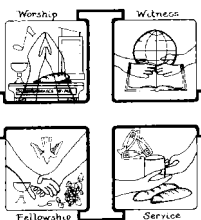

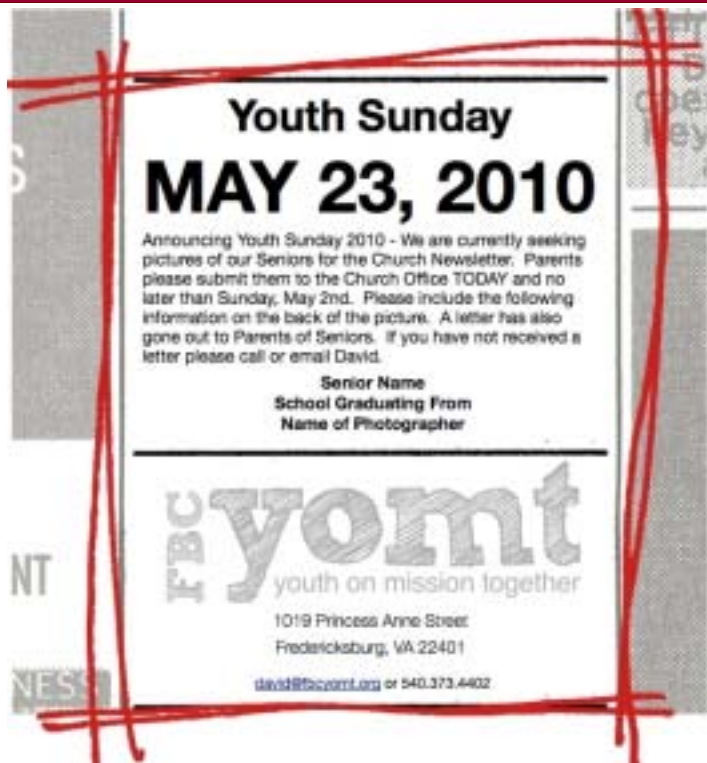

## Report on John Houghton Walk

Last Sunday, March 21, we had a glorious afternoon for a walk and walk we did! We walked in honor of John Houghton, a long-time Baptist Pastor who has also been an active denominational leader in Virginia and beyond. Because it was a walk and people were moving all over the city and because some people participated in the walk and not the meal while others enjoyed the meal and not the walk, it is difficult to know exactly how many of us were a part of that grand event, but it is estimated that there were more than 200 of us at one point or another. Along the way, we gathered others who wanted to walk with us and learn about Baptist historical sites as well as to pray for the ministries of the ten Micah Churches. The fellowship was sweet!

The meal we shared at the conclusion of the walk was a wonderful time of sharing and of offering gifts to help with Alzheimer's research. We collected \$1500 on Sunday, and several folks who walked but didn't come in for the meal, have asked where they may contribute. You are welcome to mail or bring a check by the church offices at any time, or you may place a check, made out to Fredericksburg Baptist Church (with John Houghton Walk in the memo section) in the offering plate on Sunday morning.

Many of you who walked, wore pedometers and while there was some diversity in the mileage recorded on those pedometers, we want to recommend that any of you who walked the long walk in its entirety should record a 6-mile walk on Sunday as you offer your mileage in our Walk to Jerusalem! It was really long (longer than we had anticipated) and a really good walk! Thanks to all of those who helped make it happen! Each luminary represents a memorial or honorary gesture celebrating the life of an individual who is a survivor or who has lost their personal struggle against cancer. The names of those honored and remembered are printed on the bags and it is a powerful walk of remembrance and hope! Even if you do not choose to participate for the entire evening, if you are able to go by Pratt Park at dusk and walk and read the names of those remembered, it can be a very special and touching act of prayer!

## On-Line Giving Gaining in Popularity

Nearly 50 of our members have discovered the convenience of using online giving (*E-Giving*) to make their contributions to the church. Here are a couple of comments that have been shared:

- *I have paid all of my routine bills for years with preauthorized Electronic payments so I was elated when the Church made the e-giving option available. I am frequently away on weekends visiting family so online giving ensures that my contribution is always there even if I am not.*
- *As an aged member of the church who is unable to attend church services regularly, this method of giving has been extremely helpful. Thank you for offering the service.*

Here is some basic information about *E-Giving*:

- A donation can be made at any time and from any place that has access to the internet. There is also the ability for gifts to be scheduled for a specific future time or even at regular recurring times.
- Gifts can be made to the Ministry Budget, the BUOH in Missions Budget, and the Capital Campaign.
- The church does not keep a record of your credit and debit card numbers. That information is retained and protected by the company administering the program for the church.
- You may use VISA, Mastercard, Discover, or American Express. You may also authorize transfers from your checking or saving account to be deposited directly in the church's bank account.
- To use *E-Giving*, go to [www.fredericksburgbaptistchurch.org](http://www.fredericksburgbaptistchurch.org) and click on the *E-Giving* link on the left hand side of the page. This link will take you to a page with information about *E-giving*. On this page will be a link that will take you directly to the *E-giving* page. On your first visit you will be directed to create a username and password that will be used to establish your personal account that you will use for all future transactions. Then just follow the instructions to make your gift.

Anyone may begin using this option at any time and may utilize the service as much or as little as desired. Just follow the instructions printed above if you wish to participate and should you have any questions, please contact Dennis Sacrey.

## **Lent 2010 – Walk to Jerusalem**

### **In the Fifth Week of Lent, we walked 1149.8 miles!**

### **Combined with the previous four weeks,**

### **we have a combined total of 6056.8 Miles!**

We are only about 800 miles short of our goal of reaching Jerusalem and we may have actually walked that many more miles on Sunday afternoon (it sure felt like it!) Perhaps by next week's news, we will have made it to Jerusalem and then what will we find? What will we experience during Holy Week if we are in Jerusalem? If you have thoughts on this, please feel free to email [Patti@FredericksburgBaptistChurch.org](mailto:Patti@FredericksburgBaptistChurch.org) with your ideas, suggestions, devotional insights, etc. How exciting it will be to be in Jerusalem during Holy Week!

This week if we were to continue eastward in Africa, we might arrive in Kenya, where we know of many important opportunities for ministry. Our church has been involved in ministry with Sam and Melody Harrell in several ways. So far, we have sent two groups of youth to Passport Kenya and interacted in mission and worship and life-learning experiences with the Harrell family! This summer, we are sending another group of youth to participate in Passport Kenya and we invite you to pray with our youth as they prepare to go and be a part of a camp experience with youth from Kenya and to serve alongside them in mission ministry experiences as well as discovering a great deal about the beauty of creation in a land blessed with great beauty! (You may choose to support them by participating in the Spring Auction and Fair on Saturday, May 1!)

Sam and Melody Harrell both grew up in Africa as children of missionaries – Sam in Nairobi, Kenya and Melody in Jinja, Uganda. They were commissioned as Cooperative Baptist Missionaries in 1999 and have powerful relationships with the people of Kenya because of their long-term commitment to the people, and to meeting the needs of the people.

The Harrells wanted to build on the change they have seen through previous feeding projects, agriculture advances and education initiatives. While government-sponsored primary school has been free for children since 2002, pre-school and kindergarten programs are not or are not available in rural areas. Seeing a need, the Harrells launched Change for Children with the hope that the centers would give children a head start in school and also help marginalized communities.

In Kenya, the Harrells have created Change for Children because the construction of eight integrated child development centers around Kenya has the potential to better the lives of the nearly 650 children, ranging in age from 3 to 6, who will attend the schools this year.

Our church family sponsored the construction of the Audrey Ferrell Integrated Child Development Center to honor Audrey's retirement as our church secretary after 40 years of ministry with us! That center has been completed and is operational and it is hoped that our youth will be able to visit it this summer while they are in Kenya!

"Those who follow after Jesus will recall how he often welcomed children. He also said that it would be better not to have been born than to cause harm to come to a child," said Sam.

"Unfortunately, children as a group, remain among the most vulnerable, marginalized and neglected sectors of the human family."

You are also invited to pray for Susan Snellings who will be going to Kenya this May for the Mission Emersion part of her education process at Baptist Theological Seminary at Richmond. Theresie Houghton's experiences in Kenya several years became transformational in her understanding of her own calling to ministry and has helped to shape the way that she serves God in our own community. Additionally, Tori Wentz has enjoyed opportunities to serve alongside Sam and Melody in her mission journeys!

As you can tell, our church family has a wonderful history of relationship with the Harrell Family in their ministries with the people of Kenya. So as we are going, let us pray for the ways that God may continue to use Sam and Melody in their relationships with the people of Kenya and as they take the Good News of Jesus Christ to the beautiful people of that country!

## Faith Comes By Hearing

At the beginning of the Season of Lent, we distributed a couple of hundred MP3's of the New Testament, which we received from CBF in cooperation with Faith Comes By Hearing. Many of you have commented on how much you have enjoyed listening to the New Testament and some have even reported having listened to it all the way through more than once! This is a wonderful opportunity to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with all the people of the world as we help make possible the translation of scripture into other languages! In your "Lent 2010 – Walk to Jerusalem Passport" you received an envelope to allow this offering to be possible. Now is the time to make that offering, if you are so led! Thus far, we have received \$45 in contributions toward this particular ministry with which CBF has partnered.
