July 5, 2011

*A pilgrim travels through the landscape, leaving behind all that is familiar on a journey to discover new territory, both physical and spiritual...*

In the church calendar, summer is considered "Ordinary Time," which can be filled with extraordinary riches through prayer and spiritual growth. This is an invitation to explore the spiritual practice of pilgrimage.

Walking is what pilgrims do; they pray with their feet. Prepare to walk! You'll want to **wear comfortable shoes**, and **bring a water bottle!** Our pilgrimage will begin with a contemplative procession through the Olmsted Woods, leading into the Cathedral nave.

We will receive a brief guided tour of the cathedral which reveals the biblical intentionality placed into every detail of the architecture – even in the stained glass windows! You may wish to **bring your Bible and journal** for our centering prayer experience in the Cathedral Center for Prayer and Pilgrimage. At the conclusion of our pilgrimage, we will have the opportunity to attend the Noon Eucharist in the Great Choir.

Lunch will be on your own. There are several good restaurants within walking distance of the cathedral – Mexican, pizza, chicken. After lunch, you may explore the cathedral, book store, gift shop and Bishop's Garden on the beautiful cathedral grounds. We plan to leave the cathedral by 3:00pm.

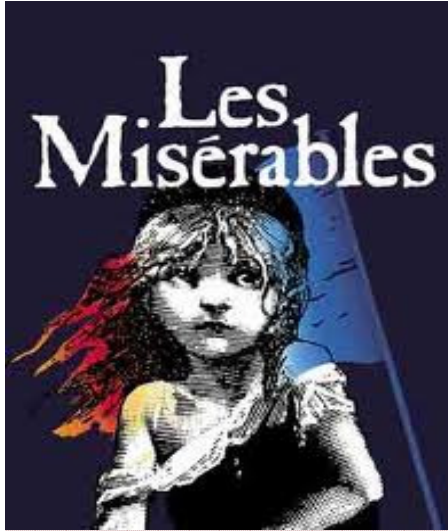

Cameron Mackintosh presents a brand new 25th anniversary production of Boublil & Schönberg's legendary musical, *Les Misérables*, with glorious new staging and spectacular reimagined scenery inspired by the paintings of Victor Hugo. Featuring such memorable songs as "On My Own," "I Dreamed a Dream," "One Day More," "Bring Him Home," and "Do You Hear the People Sing?" *Les Mis* is an epic and uplifting story about the survival of the human spirit.

Our group will leave the FBC parking lot and travel by charter bus to Washington, D.C. We will enjoy dinner together in the Kennedy Center Café, where you may choose from poultry, fish or a carved meat entrée with your meal. The performance will begin at 7:30pm and last approximately 3 hours, with an intermission.

The French word "misérables" means both poor wretches and scoundrels or villains. The two central themes that dominate the novel are the moral redemption of its main character, Jean Valjean, an ex-convict, and the moral redemption of a nation through revolution. *Les Misérables* is the story of four people, Bishop Myriel, Jean Valjean, Famine, and Marius Pontmercy, who meet, part, then meet again during the most agitated decades of nineteenth-century France. It also tells the story of the 1832 revolution.

Victor Hugo said: "I condemn slavery, I banish poverty, I teach ignorance, I treat disease, I lighten the night, and I hate hatred. That is what I am, and that is why I have written *Les Misérables*." The novel is a critical statement against human suffering, poverty, and ignorance – in essence, a plea for humane treatment of the poor and for equality among all citizens.

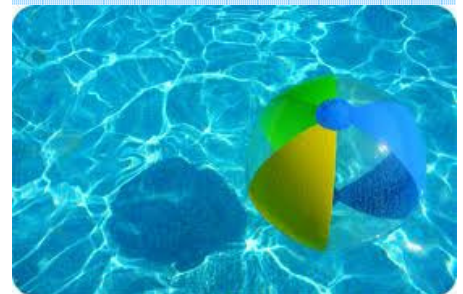
