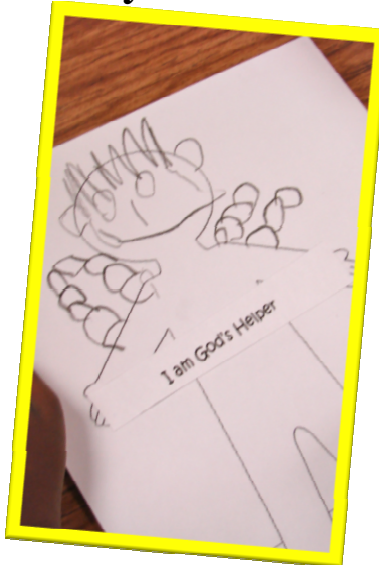

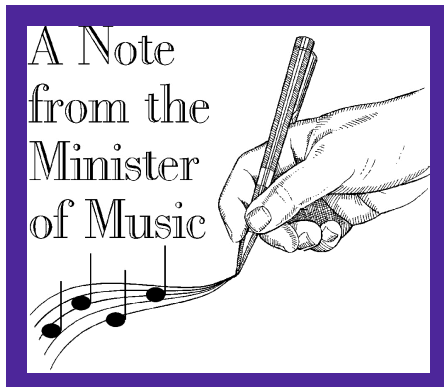

# Thoughts on Music in the Church

## Part One



Music in the church serves many purposes. Among the broader purposes are faithfulness to God's purpose for music and faithfulness in serving God's people.

### God's Purpose for Music

In Colossians 3:12-17, God gives a model for corporate worship at a church, including an instruction to sing: *Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.*

The outworking of Christ's word in our lives is to be filled with thanks for all God has done for us in Christ, and to encourage one another to give our lives to him as Lord. Singing is the expression of that in a fundamentally human way. God has given us only a few ways to express our relationship with others. We can speak, we can touch, we can read and write, we can gesture, and we can sing.

Singing is one of the most emotive ways human beings can communicate their thoughts and feelings – from the joy of a love song, to the triumph of the winning team's anthem, or the grief of a funeral song. Songs

affect us in a way that mere spoken words can't. They are emotional. They fill our eyes with tears, or help us celebrate with joy.

Music has been at the heart of creation from the beginning of time, and has been the inescapable emotional response of God's creatures to his goodness. When God laid the foundations of the earth, "all the morning stars sang together, and all the sons of God shouted for joy" (Job 38:7). And at the end of days, at the wedding feast of the Lamb, the great multitude will sing "Hallelujah! For the Lord our God the Almighty reigns!" (Revelation 19:6).

When King David established the Levitical music ministry in the tabernacle, he appointed 288 singers and musicians "to play loudly on musical instruments, on harps and lyres and cymbals, to raise sounds of joy." (1 Chronicles 15:16 and 25:7). The purpose of David's music was emotional - to help the people of Israel express the joy of knowing the Lord was their God, and all he had done for them.

So what does it mean to be faithful to God's purpose for music at church? Our singing should be a response to the God who has revealed himself in the Scriptures. Having been restored to God through the death and resurrection of Jesus, we can confidently "draw near to the throne of grace" (Hebrews 4:16).

Music helps us respond to God and God's people, as we sing of God's works, give him thanks and praise, and encourage one another to live for him.

Dr. Robert F. Caverlee, FBC pastor from 1932-1961, was recently named by the Fredericksburg City Council for inclusion on the city's Wall of Honor. Located in the Council chambers of City Hall, the wall honors those past residents of Fredericksburg whose lives impacted the community in positive and significant ways.

Known by most everyone as "Dr. Bob," Caverlee was beloved not only by the members of the church, but also by the Fredericksburg community. He had

served as the President of the Baptist General Association of Virginia and trustee of the University of Richmond, which was at the time an influential Baptist college. His civic involvement included teaching at Mary Washington College, Boy Scout leader, host of radio programs on the local radio station, and sports announcer for local high school football games. He was an avid hunter and fisherman and a founder of the local Izaak Walton League.

Dr. Caverlee also exerted a strong influence on young men by encouraging them to pursue a call to full time Christian ministry. Paige Young, retired pastor of Ferry Farms Baptist Church, and our own Jack Marcom were just two of many who responded to Caverlee's encouragement.

Upon his retirement in 1961, the church named him Pastor Emeritus and later named the chapel in his honor.
