## 2010 Budget in this Issue

Included in this newsletter is a recommended Ministry Budget for 2010 from the Stewardship Development Workgroup. The budget will be adopted at the regular business meeting on Wednesday October 28, at 7:15pm in the Caverlee Chapel.

Because of continuing economic concerns, this proposed budget is very conservative, reflecting an increase of only \$867 over the 2009 budget. Savings have been realized in some of our fixed-expense areas and personnel salary expenses have increased by a modest 1%. Questions about the proposed budget will be addressed at the business meeting. You will want to attend this time of information and begin praying and reflecting on the level of support to which God would have you commit to this coming year's work and ministry of our church.

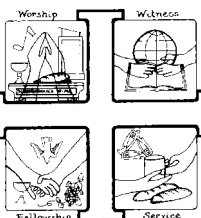
## Annual Meeting of Virginia Baptists

## **Thanksgiving is Coming and You Can Help Share It with Our Neighbors!**

**Fredericksburg Area Head Start is looking for sponsors to provide a specific but simple menu for six families of four.** This is a tradition that serves every family in their program each year, calling on community partners to help ensure that each family is served.

Head Start is a federal program for preschool children three to five years of age in low-income families. Its aim is to prepare children for success in school through an early learning program.

Lists are available from Jeanne and items can be brought to the church office or taken directly to the Head Start building (200 Gunnery Road/ The Old Walker Grant School) on either of the last two days of school before Thanksgiving, November 23<sup>rd</sup> or November 24<sup>th</sup>, before noon.

This would be a great holiday way to for classes, missions groups, or even individual families to serve their neighbor this holiday season.

**Share in Providing or Preparing or Helping to Serve Our Annual Community Thanksgiving Breakfast, Thursday, November 26<sup>th</sup>.** For several

years now, volunteers from all over the Fredericksburg area gather early Thanksgiving morning to provide a Community Breakfast for anyone who needs food or company on the holiday. Holidays can be difficult for many and this effort is another way that we not only feed the basic needs for food in our community but also the need for human care and contact. (Breakfast on this day replaces our regular Thursday evening dinner.)

Items needed to prepare breakfast will be posted on a display across from the Ladies Lounge, beginning Sunday, November 8<sup>th</sup>. When we all participate in bringing items, we share in the cost but also in a combined effort to serve, especially for those unable to be present to serve on Thanksgiving morning. All items should be brought to the church no later than noon on Wednesday, November 25<sup>th</sup>. Call Jeanne in the church office with questions.

If you are available to help prepare breakfast on Thanksgiving morning, please arrive by 6:30 am and enter through the Caroline Street entrance. As you arrive, a greeter will meet you and help you discover your task in the kitchen.

If you are available to help serve breakfast, please arrive by 7:45 am.

Clean-up help is always needed throughout the meal and after. Please plan to arrive by 7:45 am if you would like to help with dishes and by 8:45 am if you'd like to help us re-set the room and sweep up. Join us as we serve together on this special day of giving thanks.

### **A Busy and Blessed October at FBC!**

Over the past few weeks we have experienced some

amazing blessings in service here at Fredericksburg Baptist.

**On October 5<sup>th</sup>, we began after-school homework help in our building, every Monday-Thursday.** Focusing on the needs of new English Language Learners, we partnered for transportation with the Fredericksburg City Schools. Several of you have offered much needed gifts of school supplies and study aids. The Fredericksburg Area Retired Educators have provided volunteers, and some of you have also shared your gifts, sitting patiently with students as they completed work often complicated by educational lags and language. Students are in grades K-12, and, currently, all are former refugees. This type of help is best when a ratio of one helper to one or two students is maintained. We need you to do our best for them! This ministry is about equipping these young people for the future while also helping them to have a positive school experience; they know we, our church family, cares for them! Jeanne can answer questions about the program and Sarah Bush can help you volunteer.

**October 6<sup>th</sup> began our largest registration for Conversational English.** Our dedicated teachers welcomed over 75 students to a new year of English acquisition and practice. Childcare was provided to over 30 children. We need your help in all areas of this ministry! More teachers would alleviate overcrowding in classes and more help with children would make for happier babies and preschoolers! With questions or to volunteer, please contact Jeanne and Sarah.

**The week continued on with registration for Citizenship Classes on October 7.** This new ministry is forming with Charlie Haun and Jennifer Graham as its first teachers. Sarah King will be joining them as lead teacher for a second class. The class meets from 6-7 pm each Wednesday and an easy to follow curriculum is being used. A third class for youth seeking citizenship is needed. We'll be looking for a helper with Sarah's class and a team of two for the youth class. These classes are offered to our community as a means of equipping our new neighbors in their efforts to fully embrace their new country. Jeanne and Sarah can help you learn more about this ministry and help you get involved.

As we have already begun to feel the chill of winter in the last couple weeks, we can anticipate the need for those living outdoors as the cold quickly approaches.

Consider being a part of our church's Cold Weather Shelter team on Thursday nights this year...

Volunteers will sign up to be "on-call" for specific Thursdays and will receive notice by 2pm that day if the shelter will be open.

Opportunities to serve may include the following:

- Cot set-up (starting at 6:30pm)
- Check-in and greeting (starting at 7:15pm)
- Night Transportation\* (starting at 6:45pm)
- Morning Transportation\* (starting at 6:45am)
- Light snack preparation
