If you want to worship God on Sundays at Fredericksburg Baptist Church, there are plenty of opportunities! We continue to offer worship times at 8:30 and 11:00 am. There is a time of worship from 12:30 to 3:00 pm with our Burundian members using Kirundi and Swahili as the primary languages. Our Bhutanese members are worshipping together from 5 to 7:00 pm primarily using the Nepali language. And, soon, a new worship service will be added each Sunday evening beginning at 7:00 pm.



Anyone is welcome to attend any or all of the five services each Sunday. And, it would be to all of our best interest as a common body to spend some time in each of the alternative worship settings offered. We will learn a great deal about the many ways that God has gifted us to worship in each setting, and we will see with new eyes that the way we claim as "our" way to worship is not the only way that God values.

As we are reminded in 1 Corinthians, the many

varieties of worship are not divisions but are extensions of the same Spirit, the same Lord, the same God, and are each expressions of the Spirit for the common good—our common good as a household of God and the common good of the community and world around us.

together! (Ps.34:3)**

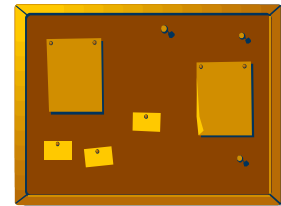

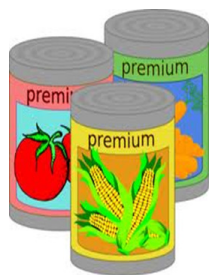

## Bluefield College Makes it Easier to Get Your Degree!

Lisa Bales, the Fredericksburg representative for Bluefield College, will be conducting six upcoming information sessions for adults who want to complete their college degree.

The sessions will be held in the youth pod room at the Fredericksburg Baptist Church at 1019 Princess Anne Street. Interested individuals may also schedule separate sessions with her if they cannot attend on the scheduled dates. The scheduled sessions will be held on a flexible schedule to meet the individual's needs:

**Mon. Nov 28- 6:00 to 8:00pm**

**Tues. Nov 29- 6:00 to 8:00pm**

**Mon. Dec 5- 6:00 to 8:00pm**

**Tues. Dec 6- 6:00 to 8:00pm**

Adults who have earned college credits in the past can attend to find out about Bluefield's accelerated degree completion program called inSPIRE. This program offers bachelors' degree completion programs in human services, management and leadership, nursing and public safety. All programs are structured in an online format and are tailored to meet the needs of the busy working adult. Those who have earned professional training certificates in the past may be awarded college credit towards their degree.

The nursing degree is for those who already have their registered nurse certification. The public safety degree offers concentrations in criminal justice, homeland security- critical infrastructure, homeland security- emergency management, and pre-law.

The online courses are taken in eight-week sub-terms, usually two courses every eight weeks. The next start dates are October 24 and January 9. A student can begin a degree completion program at any of the eight-week start

dates that Bluefield College offers throughout the year.

Bluefield College has reduced its tuition by 20%, at a time when most colleges are increasing their tuition. The college is also assuming the cost of students' books and has cut fees, as well as awarding a free Dell netbook to each student who enrolls. Bluefield wants to make it easier for working adults to go back to school in a challenging economic climate.

## Happiness at the Harvest Festival; Reflections from Donna Brosmer

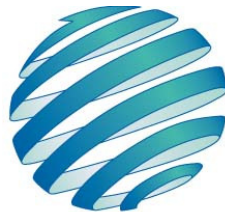

## A Visit from Two Very Special CBF Missionaries This Sunday

This Sunday, November 20<sup>th</sup>, two missionaries of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship will be visiting with us in worship and during the Sunday School hour. The names of these field personnel are not published, for their protection. They serve in Southeast Asia, facilitating the first translations of the Bible into ethnic languages.

They have worked with villagers to translate legends, oral history and stories of daily life. And they've trained villagers to teach the language, so that the work will continue" even after they leave.

Many of you will remember that several years ago, our church joined in a covenant to support this couple and the transformative work that is taking place among the marginalized hill tribe people with whom they work. One of our Women's Missions Circles is named for one of these missionaries! Many of us remain in prayer for this couple.
